Another Point of View

On the opening night, a free shuttle will leave Paris (*Place de la République/metro République/exit Rue du Temple*) at 6:30 pm. Estimated return time 9:30 pm. No advance booking; seating subject to availability.

The visual image has become ubiquitous and we are now completely dependent on it in our daily lives. This constant bombardment of images – virtual, digital and moving – from our phones, televisions, computers and the Internet, for our use and consumption, is overwhelming. We are so surrounded by images that we don't even register them anymore.

The exhibition "Another Point of View" examines how artists work with images of the everyday and give them a different meaning. The artists search and investigate our cities and surroundings, making us stop and look at imagery that we have ignored and overlooked. Considering our world from new positions, they bring into focus small details as well as the big picture. The five artists in the exhibition share an interest in the possibilities of presenting past and present, and blurring the limits between fiction and reality. They investigate omitted footage, take new pictures and tell stories. We accompany them on their walks, drifting through the city, discovering new street corners, shop windows and bus shelters.

Polish filmmaker **Józef Robakowski** filmed the same view from his window for over two decades, even this tiny fragment of the world managing to reveal enormous changes in Polish society.

American artist **Amie Siegel**, working in modern-day Berlin, re-films the same scenes, at the same locations, that appear in old GDR movies shot in East Berlin, juxtaposing the original and remade footage side-by-side, raising questions about the veracity of what we are seeing.

German artist **Peter Piller** re-orders and stages new and existing images, giving them a new meaning through is re-arrangements and making unexpected connections between these ordinary and forgotten urban fragments.

Irish artist **Gerard Byrne** presents his monochrome photographs of the United States, and even though all them have been taken during the last five years, the images convey an atmosphere of an earlier time.

French artist **Marcelline Delbecq** uses narrative, combining words and sounds to create mental images that hover between description and fiction, past and present.

The exhibition proposes a different way of seeing our changing world. Of looking at the exceptional within normality, of being aware of the small and constant changes occurring in our surroundings.
